President's Message:



President Obama's State of the Union address last month was the moment many Democrats were waiting for: a full-throated endorsement of

liberal, Democratic ideas. The President showed where our country has made great strides in strengthening the economy, shrinking the deficit, boosting scientific research, and ending the Iraq and Afghanistan wars. But he also showed where we still have room for improvement. And of course, everyone was buzzing about Mr. Obama's off-the-cuff jab at a group of heckling lawmakers: "I have no more campaigns to run...I know, because I won both of them."

Following the rout from the 2014 midterm Congressional elections, Mr. Obama could have lurched to the right in order to pander to the smaller, more conservative electorate that showed up in November. Instead, he doubled down on progressive values with a new list of priorities he wants to work with the Congress to deliver on: free community college, tax credits for child care, paid sick

leave, a free and open Internet, tax fairness, fighting climate change. With bold moves such as protecting immigrant children from deportation and taking the first step toward normalizing relations with Cuba, Mr. Obama is demonstrating that he will be no "lame duck."

Still, though the President proclaimed that the "state of the union is strong," it may not feel that way to many Americans. Since the beginning of Mr. Obama's administration, the United States has regained the amount of jobs lost in the Great Recession. According to the White House, 11.2 million jobs have been created in the past five years. Yet, there are still millions more people looking for work, and for the majority of those who are working, wages remain stagnant. The Affordable Care Act has significantly reduced the number of uninsured Americans nationwide, and has halved the number of uninsured in California. But, experts say, 30 million Americans will remain uninsured, even after the ACA is fully implemented. And finally, as the recent protests against police brutality and the aftermath of [See **President**, Page 2]

Statements from Candidates for First Vice-President

As voted on by the members at the January General Meeting, the election for the First Vice-President for the Club will be held at February's meeting. Also, the vote for Corresponding Secretary will be conducted immediately after the vote for First VP. For both offices beyond the already nominated candidates a call for nominations from the floor will be made before the vote for each office. All candidates will be given the opportunity to speak before the body prior to the vote. Here are the statements from the candidates for First VP.

Khin Khin Gyi:

As a board member of Citizens Coalition for a Safe Community and as a neurologist, I have worked tirelessly to inform the residents of Culver City and LA County about the adverse health effects of chemicals produced in the course of oil extraction. As a member of the Angeles chapter of the Sierra Club, I have worked to defend our right to clean air, water and land use over the right of corporations seeking profits at the expense of our health.

Having served as president emeritus of the Culver Crest Neighborhood Association for two years has taught me the skills of engaging and empowering a community to stand up for its rights, whether it be facing parking issues with West LA College or Freeport McMoran Oil & Gas Co. at the monthly CAP (Community Advisory Panel) meetings.

Currently, I am working with PSR-

LA (Physicians for Social Responsibility) to create a 1500 foot buffer zone between sensitive receptors (schools, nursing homes, residences and churches) and already approved urban oil wells. This would be a push back from the current 500 feet buffer zone that presently exists in Los Angeles. I would be honored to receive your vote for the position of first vice president and will be bringing a collaborative coalition to work to achieve our common vision and shared mission.

Stephen Murray:

Our Club is here to improve peoples lives. We are united by our values and vision of a just and equal society. Holding this vision creates the freedoms that we all enjoy.

Our Club should help move community discourse to this vision every month, not just during the elections. We need to explore and reinforce the freedoms that can give us affordable education and livable wages, gender and marriage equality, and the ability to enjoy our health and safety free from fear and corporate influences.

Our Club needs to take hold of our local offices. We should be proactively vetting and encouraging the next leaders that will stand up for our community in the 2016 and 2018 City Council, in our School Board, and in our Assembly.

The City's Democrats are fractured between the Chamber, UPCC, our teachers union and our progressive activists. We need to engage with each of these elements. We need to be

out in the community bringing people in by championing our higher Democratic ideals.

I have a vision towards unifying the clubs in West LA. I want us to try to share events during the month and share our best practices. Elected officials don't care about clubs until elections. I want to help increase our influence to become the greater resource our community needs.

We are called a Democratic Club but I think we're here to help make our community better.
